THE SACRED DANCE BETWEEN TRADITION AND INNOVATION

The mission of Temple Isaiah is to be **“your home at the intersection of tradition and innovation.”** Each day we pivot between past and future; between lessons from our rich history and dreams for a vibrant tomorrow.

For some, this might feel like constant, disorienting change. But for the clergy at Isaiah, it feels more like a dance.

In the dance, Judaism stays relevant and meaningful - not just for us, but for our children and grandchildren.

It isn't always easy, neither are the steps simple. But in our discomfort, there is holiness. In the disruption one finds growth and the potential to experience profound joy.

This year we debuted a new Friday night experience: Shabbchella. For some, the very name (in case you missed it, a hybrid between “Shabbat” and “Coachella,” the well-known annual music festival) might present an immediate disorientation.

On select dates throughout the year (February 21 and May 8) our synagogue will transform into a music festival with activities for all ages including for all ages including face painting, flower crown making, a communal art project, dance party and beer garden (that last one for adults only).

The music of Shabbchella will be based on the traditional themes of our prayers and feature the transformative music from secular artists you know and love. However, there won't be any Hebrew or traditional Jewish melodies. We will explore what it means to connect with Shabbat

in modern ways. Amid all the fun of Shabbchella, however, is the tradition of Shabbat. The moment of pause at the end of a long week. Learning, celebrating, singing and dancing with community. Being together. A connection to something bigger than ourselves. These are timeless themes and indeed, they have been a part of the very fabric of Isaiah for decades.

When we gather for Shabbchella, we will indeed dance at the **intersection** of **tradition** and **innovation**.

And so, this year - all year round - we ask you to step closer to that very intersection. Welcome in the comfort and discomfort. Embrace the routine and the unexpected. Consider how you might join in this dance with tradition and innovation, adding your own unique steps.

Join us as we practice, play, question, challenge, mourn and celebrate.

We promise to save you a spot on our dance floor.

WHAT'S YOUR ISAIAH STORY?

Jonah Shabsis recounts his Isaiah Story at Yom Kippur Services, 2019, and inspires us to Give.

Good morning, I am Jonah Shabsis.

I know that many of you have heard the annual pledge drive on NPR. This part of our service will be a little like that.

I am here to share my personal Isaiah story. My hope is that while I speak, you will be reminded of your own and be inspired to reach for that donation envelope and pledge a little (or even A LOT).

What you give supports our community in so many ways. **My Isaiah Story** starts at preschool, followed by several years of Hebrew School, and becoming a Bar Mitzvah this past May. And while this may sound like the traditional path traveled by a typical Jewish kid, I have encountered potholes along the way.

Let's just say that I got off to a rocky start in preschool -- my nickname might have been "Jaws." As they say in preschool, I had a challenge controlling my body because of my learning differences.

No matter my struggles, the preschool staff and clergy were always supportive of me and my family. They accepted me, and my differences, embraced my family and ALWAYS made us feel welcomed and part of this community.

After preschool, I continued on to the religious school. At the beginning, it was a breeze. Who doesn't like to decorate challah covers, make original seder plates and hannukiahs out of bolts while singing Jewish camp songs?

All kidding aside, walking into Temple and seeing my preschool friends every week was like coming home. It was a safe space where I knew I was loved and accepted.



But then came Hebrew. Oy! For a kid like me, learning to read a new alphabet, and backwards, shall we say was not a breeze.

And again, with the support and encouragement from the Isaiah community, I stayed on my Jewish learning path.

I started taking guitar lessons with song leader Danny; learning my favorite Jewish camp songs and even getting to play on the bima during Shabbat services and at Camp Isaiah.

Becoming a Bar Mitzvah I conquered Hebrew, and had the great joy of reading from Isaiah's **Orphan Scroll Torah** in honor all of those who were not able to become Bar/Bat Mitzvah because of the Shoah -- which is also part of my story too as a great grandchild of holocaust survivors.

On my Bar Mitzvah day, I once again found myself surrounded and supported by our Temple Isaiah community, which is a testament to the incredible people who make us uniquely Isaian.

A shout out to a few special people—the Lonners, Lexi Weiss and Brody Holtzman for just **#beingisaian**.

As I look back on my experiences at Temple Isaiah, I realize all the gifts I have been given just by walking in those doors on Pico Blvd.

Friends. Education. Jewish values. A deep love for Judaism.



Let's not discount the work my family has put in to bring me here, but what you should know, for a kid "on the spectrum"..... having a strong Jewish identity that has nothing to do with a diagnosis is truly a special gift.

Today, Isaiah continues to push me to go that extra step because they know I can.

Later this year, I will travel to Israel on the Temple's **Twining** program with a preschool friend who has been there for me all along my journey because we stay connected through religious school.

So now, with gratitude, I am going to fill out my own pledge envelope...

....Pen, please!

Because I have some Bar Mitzvah money that I can think of no better purpose than supporting another quirky kid like me so they can be accepted by our special community.

I hope you will follow my lead.
