K-12 Education

Religious School (TK-6th Grade):

Our largest program! Grade-level community building (kehillah), immersive Jewish learning, Hebrew, and a range of rotating, age-appropriate topics including the Jewish holidays, the Jewish life cycle, Torah, Israel, and values.

Sundays, 9:30a.m.–12:30p.m. (bagels & coffee begin at 9a.m.)

Tuition: \$2,100 (Includes K-12 Security and Fees to support The Neighborhood, our K-12 Parent-Led Community Engagement Group)

NEW! Club Isaiah After School (TK-5th Grade):

Our newest offering is a Jewish after-school experience, including transportation from select local elementary schools with a low 1:10 teacher-to-student ratio, two to five days each week. *Club Isaiah will also offer à la carte full-day programming during LAUSD school closures, including holidays and parent-teacher conference days.

Pop Up Choir (TK-6th Grade):

Sing with Cantor Schloss and songleader Sophie Feldman! The group meets most Sundays after Religious School to learn and rehearse music to share with our congregation and school community. Includes pizza lunch and community fun.

When: Most Sundays, 12:30–1:15 p.m.

Tuition: No additional cost

Hebrew Intensive Class (4th-7th Grades):

Perfect for students ready to dive even deeper into Hebrew, prayer and Jewish literacy through prayer-based and modern Hebrew practice, including additional holiday and Hebrew texts.

When: Tuesdays, 4:00–6:00 p.m.

Tuition: \$2,100 (Includes K-12 Security and Fees to support The Neighborhood, our K-12 Parent-Led Community Engagement Group)

Religious School Retreat (4th-7th Grades):

Each year we retreat to a local camp for a weekend celebrating Shabbat, learning, laughing, singing and goofing around together. Open to all in the 4th-7th Grades.

Friday, September 25 (Drop off at Temple, 2:30 p.m.) through Sunday, September 27 (Pick up at Temple, 11:00 a.m.)

Cost: \$450 (early bird – until August 16), \$500 (regular pricing)

Hebrew Tutoring 1-1 (All Grades):

One-on-one Hebrew tutoring tailored to your family's schedule. Ideal for extra support, new learners, or those needing extra support leading up to Bar/Bat Mitzvah preparation. This is separate from Bar/Bat Mitzvah Tutoring, which is arranged through Cantor Schloss' office.

30-45 minute sessions are scheduled between the assigned tutor and the family, on Zoom or in-person

Tuition: \$1,080 (1 semester), \$2,160 (two semesters) or \$2,880 (two semesters + summer sessions)

Isaiah Teens

Unlock a world of opportunity for teens at Temple Isaiah! Dive into engaging evenings filled with friendship, learning and Jewish values. From leadership development to classroom leadership, there's something for every teen!

Isaiah Temple Youth (ITY) (8th - 12th Grades):

ITY is a teen-led space for 8th through 12th graders to gather regularly for service projects, Shabbat and holiday celebrations, game nights and overall fun. Tuesday Teen Program (8th - 10th Grades):

Teens can begin the evening in our Teen Lounge also known as the Kleinrock Schuler Center for Innovation at 5 p.m. At 6 p.m. students enjoy dinner together, followed by learning by grade as well as electives offered across all grades.

Tuesdays, 6:00–8:00 p.m. (Lounge time begins at 5 p.m.)

Confirmation (10th Grade):

10th Grade students are invited for a special course of study on Jewish values and responsibility. Confirmation students are invited to participate in our annual trip to Washington, D.C. for the Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism's L'taken Social Justice Seminar (February 19–22, 2027).

Tuesdays, 6:00–8:00 p.m.

Tuition: \$2,630 (Includes K-12 Security and Fees to support The Neighborhood, our K-12 Parent-Led Community Engagement Group)

Introduction to the Culture, History and People of Israel (10th - 12th Grades):

Working with our community partners at the American Jewish University, we are delighted to be able to offer this course for college credit – taught by members of our clergy.

Tuesdays, 5:30–8:00 p.m., 16-weeks (November–March)

Tuition: \$150 (Registration fee for Temple Isaiah)

Tuition is paid to AJU, separately, \$1,300 per student + a \$90 student fee

Rishonim-in-Training (7th Grade):

The Rishonim-in-Training program is a leadership development track designed for 7th grade students ready to transition from learners to mentors and influencers within our Religious School and beyond. This weekly program offers a unique blend of hands-on experience and professional growth.

Sundays, 9:00 a.m.–12:30 p.m.

Tuition: \$2,100

Junior Rishonim (8th & 9th Grades):

8th and 9th graders are invited to deepen their connection with Isaiah and continue growing as Jewish leaders by being placed in classrooms and with specialists each week. Mandatory professional development sessions take place twice each semester after Religious School until 2:00 p.m.

Sundays, 9:00 a.m.–12:30 p.m.

Tuition: No cost. Program is eligible for school-required service hours.

Rishonim Fellowship (10th - 12th Grades):

10th–12th graders can apply to become Rishonim, supporting Religious School classrooms and specialists, and receive a generous stipend thanks to the Gail Solo Youth Opportunity Scholarship Fund. Mandatory professional development sessions take place twice each semester after Religious School until 2:00 p.m.

Sundays, 9:00 a.m.–12:30 p.m.

Tuition: No cost. Fellows will receive a stipend of \$2,000 in two payments, at the end of each semester.
